The Kick-Off Meeting **took place in December 2024 in Teruel, Spain**, hosted by Cámara de Comercio de Teruel. This two-day event marked the launch of our shared journey toward promoting sustainable entrepreneurship in the food and gastronomy sector.

This visit sparked a fruitful exchange of ideas and opened the door to a collaboration, positioning the school as a key stakeholder in the project. Involving such institutions is essential to bridging the gap between education and sustainable entrepreneurship in the gastronomy sector.

The meeting concluded with concrete next steps, clear deadlines, and a shared sense of motivation. Partners committed to staying on track and actively contributing to each phase of the project.

Teruel was not only a beautiful setting for our first meeting – it was a place where ideas took shape, collaborations were strengthened, and the path forward was clearly defined.

We are currently working on WP2: **Skills Needs Assessment**, and part of this effort includes a short survey aimed at professionals in the gastronomy and education sectors.
